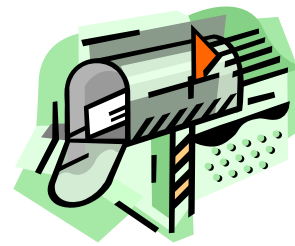

On June 10, 2009, James S. Meckel, Sr., our President and long-time Trustee, passed away.

Jim joined the Board of Trustees in January, 1995 as Vice President in charge of Buildings and Grounds. He was instrumental in the planning, design and construction of our two Mausoleums. He also oversaw the paving of roads in the Park, opening several new burial areas and dredging Mirror Lake.

Jim was a devout Christian, a member of Christ Episcopal Church in Riverton, faithful friend and loving husband, father and grandfather. He was a resident of Cinnaminson for 45 years and served several terms on Township Committee and was Mayor in 1977. His presence will be missed by all who had the pleasure to know him.

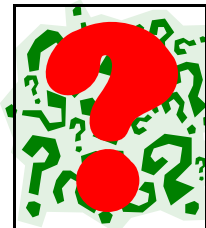

that on the 31st day of December, 1929, Francis B. Wallen, Frank B. Hanna, Walter Tushingham, George E. Wilder, of the City and County of Camden, State of New Jersey; Roy A. Ramey of the City and County of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania; Frank A. Mathews, Jr. of Palmyra, Clifford R. Powell of Mount Holly, both of the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, desiring to form an Association for the purpose of procuring and holding lands to be used exclusively for a Cemetery or place for the burial of the dead, met at the office of Waddington & Mathews for the purpose of forming an Association and did determine upon the name of Lakeview Memorial Association as the corporate name by which such Association shall be called and known as . . . Next year, 2010, will be Lakeview Memorial Park's 80th Anniversary although the park was incorporated in 1930, it was not until June, 1931 that the first burial took place. From then until October of this year there have been 24,972 interments in the Park.

### Some Reminders . . . . .

Fresh Cut flowers are welcome on graves, but are not permitted on the crypts or niches in or near our mausoleums. The Association reserves the right to remove such flowers and the holders containing the flowers when they become unsightly. Although the owner or visitor forfeits all right, title and interest in the holders and the Association may dispose of them at its sole discretion, the Association generally makes holders available for reuse by any person. A barrel containing these recycled holders is located near the entrance to the office.

Winter wreaths and/or evergreen blankets are welcome on graves during the period from December 1 through March 1, but are not permitted on the crypts or niches in or near the Mausoleums. The winter wreaths and evergreen blankets shall be removed on or after March 1 or when they become unsightly.



Potted flowers or plants, wreaths, baskets of flowers, and other seasonal adornments are welcome on graves on or around Easter Sunday, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Memorial Day, Veterans' Day, and Christmas, but are not permitted on the crypts or niches in or near the Mausoleums. The potted flowers and other seasonal adornments will be removed ten (10) days after these special days and the owner or visitor forfeits all rights, title and interest therein and the Association may dispose of them at its sole discretion.

A few examples of what is strictly prohibited in the Park as noted in Section 43 of the Rules and Regulations are: balloons, bird houses, candles, vigil lights, toys, stuffed animals, statues, temporary markers, decorative flags, glassware, sprinkling cans, trellises, wind chimes, boxes, receptacles, stones, shells, wood chips, or any other adornment or landscaping material similar in nature.

Once again, it is our desire to maintain a quiet, beautiful place where a sense of repose will be obtained by dignified landscape effects and well maintained interment sites.
